Levitate appointed to plan King's Lynn riverfront regeneration

Levitate, in collaboration with regeneration consultants Urban Delivery, has been appointed by the Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk to prepare a regeneration concept and delivery plan for the historic King's Lynn riverfront area.

The London-based team was selected following the submission of proposals and a competitive interview in May.

The plan will assess the feasibility of mixed-use regeneration options and will be an important component of the council's vision for King's Lynn, providing a set of viable concepts and an implementation strategy for the redevelopment of key sites and vacant properties on the riverfront.

The unique riverfront area stretches from Purfleet Quay in the north to Friars Fleet in the south and encompasses Boal Quay and the Grade II listed Sommerfeld & Thomas warehouse and site of the former grain silos.

Levitate director Tim Sloan says, "We're looking forward to working with the council and community of King's Lynn to help revive this historically important area and give it the opportunity to flourish."
